Admission check list

1. Complete & submit the Cox College application along with \$50 application fee through one of the following methods:
Priority service date: A minimum of 2 months prior to the start of the semester.
- Complete the application online at www.coxcollege.edu
 - Request a Cox College application by mail and return it to the College
 - Attend one of our Open House events

You will be contacted by an admissions counselor within 2-3 weeks via email or mail. He/she will let you know what additional documents and/or transcripts are needed.

2. Complete your FAFSA application at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Our school code is 013877. *Not required by recommended.*
Priority service date: A minimum of 4 weeks prior to the start of the semester.

 - Contact our Financial Aid department at 417/269-3401 for assistance.

3. Request that your official transcripts be sent to Cox College
- We will need your high school transcript or GED.
 - We will need your transcripts from ALL colleges/universities in which you have completed college level courses.
 - It can take up to 3 weeks for us to receive your transcripts once you have requested them to be sent.

4. Take entrance exam
- You will need to take the TEAS exam if:
 1. You have completed less than 12 college credit hours and have not taken the ACT or SAT within the last 5 years or,
 2. You have an ACT score below 18.
 - Contact the Academic Resource Center at 417/269-3225 to schedule exam.

5. Apply to the specific program by the listed deadline if you meet the program requirements.

6. Take HESI A2 exam. To be scheduled with the Academic Resource Center at 417/269-3225.

Program Application Requirements

1. Submission of Cox College Nursing Program Application.
2. Completion of Intermediate Algebra or higher or prove math proficiency. Proficiency met with a 22 or higher on Math portion of ACT or 70% of higher on Math portion of TEAS.
3. A minimum of a 2.75 cumulative GPA is required to apply. A minimum of 2.5 cumulative GPA for core science courses. Science courses include: Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, Microbiology and Nutrition.
4. Must have at least 1 core science and 3 additional general education courses to apply. A minimum of 12 credit hours completed. Intermediate Algebra does not count towards the 12 credit minimum.
5. Take HESI A2 exam. To be scheduled through the Academic Resource Center after submission of program application.
6. Qualified applicants will be interviewed once they meet the above requirements.

Benefits of ASN Program

- The ASN Program is a quicker plan of study to become a nurse. The courses are completed in 2 years/4 semesters allowing you to work as an RN while continuing to work toward a BSN if desired. Many health care institutions offer tuition assistance for employees wishing to further their education so there is the potential you would have financial assistance to gain your BSN.
- Strong results on NCLEX: NCLEX pass rates: 98.25% (4 semester average).
- Great for students who need more flexibility due to obligations like family, jobs, etc. Semester plan of study is average of 9-10 credit hours per semester, allowing more time to work and spend with your family.
- Three step approach to learning: lecture, skills training, and hands-on clinical practice within CoxHealth.
- State of the Art Simulation Center located on campus that offers “real-life” situations where students can practice in a controlled environment.
- Small class size: 40 students are admitted each semester.

Program Application Requirements

1. Submission of Cox College Nursing Program Application.
2. Completion of Intermediate Algebra or higher or prove math proficiency. Proficiency met with a 22 or higher on Math portion of ACT or 70% of higher on Math portion of TEAS.
3. A minimum of a 2.75 cumulative GPA and 37 credit hours (minimum) must be completed to apply.
4. A minimum of a 2.5 science cumulative GPA is required to apply. Courses included: Microbiology, Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, and Nutrition.
5. Take HESI A2 exam. To be scheduled through the Academic Resource Center after submission of program application.
6. Qualified applicants will be interviewed once they meet the above requirements.

Benefits of BSN Program

- The BSN program encompasses all of the course work taught in the ASN program plus a more in-depth treatment of the physical and social sciences, nursing research, public and community health, nursing management, and the humanities.
- Strong results on NCLEX: NCLEX pass rates: 88% (4 year average)
- State of the Art Simulation Center located on campus that offers “real-life” situations where students can practice in a controlled environment.
- Three step approach to learning: lecture, skills training, and hands-on clinical practice within CoxHealth.
- Program length: Once accepted into the nursing program, the program will take 5 semesters/2.5-years to complete.
- Small class size: 40 students are admitted each semester.

Bachelors of Science in Nursing – Accelerated Track

- **Must have completed a baccalaureate degree by the application deadline.**
- All listed general education course must be completed by start of the nursing program. Must have a minimum combined GPA of 2.75 or higher for the required general education courses and combined Science GPA of 2.5 or higher for completed science courses to apply.
- Take HESI A2 exam. To be scheduled through the Academic Resource Center after submission of program application.
- Qualified applicants will be interviewed once they meet the above requirements.
- Once accepted into the nursing program, the program will take 16 months to complete.
- NCLEX pass rates: 99% (5 year average)
- Small class size: 32 accepted once a year with 60-75 applying for those spots.

How do you become a Registered Nurse?

To work as a registered nurse (RN) you must first obtain an Associate of Science or Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree. Graduates will be prepared to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). After passing this examination, you will be able to begin your career as an RN.

What are the job placement rates for Cox College students?

Registered Nurses are in high demand and so are Cox College students. Of the students surveyed at time of graduation, 88% of our nursing students had accepted a job offer.
