



Admission check list

- 1. Complete & submit the Cox College application along with \$50 application fee.
Priority service date: A minimum of 2 months prior to the start of the semester.
 - Through one of the following methods:
 1. Complete the application online at www.coxcollege.edu
 2. Request a Cox College application by mail and return it to the College
 3. Attend one of our Open House events
 - You will be contacted by an admissions counselor within 2-3 weeks via email or mail. He/she will let you know what additional documents and/or transcripts are needed.

- 2. Complete your FAFSA application at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Our school code is 013877.
Priority service date: A minimum of 4 weeks prior to the start of the semester.
 - Visit www.FederalStudentAid.ed.gov for more info on financial aid.
 - Contact our Financial Aid department at 417/269-3401 for assistance.*Not required but recommended.*

- 3. Request that your official transcripts be sent to Cox College
 - We will need your high school transcript or GED.
 - We will need your transcripts from ALL colleges/universities in which you have completed college level courses.
 - It can take up to 3 weeks for us to receive your transcripts once you have requested them to be sent.

- 4. Apply to the specific program by the listed deadline if you meet the program requirements.

- 5. Take HESI A2 exam. To be scheduled with the Academic Resource Center at 417/269-3225.

- 6. Schedule testing for the ACE exams
These exams allow you to attempt to move forward in either the ASN or BSN programs. To test out of the ASN or BSN nursing courses LPN's will need to schedule the ACE exam with the ARC. There is a cost associated with the exam. To gain credit value (CV) for the course you will need to score a 70% or higher on the exam. Students are allowed to take each exam up to two times.

To apply to the LPN to ASN bridge program you must have completed 1 core science, 3 additional general education courses listed and prove math proficiency. Science and additional general education courses must total 12 credits or more. Must have a minimum combined GPA of 2.75 or higher for the required general education courses to apply.

To start the program you will need to have completed the following courses; Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, Microbiology, Chemistry, Intermediate Algebra, Introduction to Psychology and Computer Resources.

LPN Advance Placement Quick Facts

- There is no age limit on general education courses (science courses included) if you have been working as an LPN.
- You are given credit for your LPN education.
- As an LPN you can move ahead in the program based on scoring on the ACE exam. This exam is administered after application.

ASN: Childbearing, Care of Child and Pharmacology.

BSN: Childbearing, Care of Child, Pharmacology and Mental Health.

- The BSN program can be completed in as little as 16 months depending on the degree you wish to pursue and your scoring on the ACE exam.
- The ASN program can be completed in as little as 12 months depending on the degree you wish to pursue and your scoring on the ACE exam.
- As a CoxHealth employee you are eligible to receive a 20% discount on tuition.
- Deadlines for admission to the program:

We admit for the Spring and Fall semesters. Acceptance to the program is a rolling acceptance. To be considered applications must be complete one month prior to the start of the entering semester. Seats are filled on a first come, first serve basis.

- Financial Aid is available. You will need to complete your FASFA to determine the amount of aid you may qualify for.
- You are never too old to continue your education.
