Traditional Pathway

The traditional pathway is for those who will receive a bachelor's degree prior to beginning the MSOT program.

Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant Pathway

Those who are practicing COTAs can apply to the MSOT program through this pathway. The pre-requisite course "Medical Terminology" is not required for these applicants. A COTA can also waive the "proof of 15 hours of clinical observation."

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
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Accelerated Pathway



Note that a felony conviction may affect a graduate's ability to sit for the NBCOT certification examination or attain state licensure.
