Faculty Role

Faculty in the student's course will be in ongoing communication with you. They will review your evaluations of the student to identify action plans for improvement. They will serve as your primary point of communication and help you with any clinical evaluation tools such as Typhon. They will also serve as a point of communication between preceptors and the College. You will be contacted by faculty early in the semester to get the ball rolling and answer any questions.

Your Role

Your responsibilities include:

- Submit required documents such as preceptor agreement and CV to the College
- Participate in planning positive, realistic student learning experiences that meet the course objectives as well as agency and College policies
- Provide on-going communication to the student and faculty member.
 Intervene early and often when a student is not meeting objectives, in order that the student may have a reasonable opportunity to improve
- Provide oral and written feedback to the student and faculty about the experience
- Provide a formal evaluation of the experience twice per semester to the course faculty through Typhon software
